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





HARMFUL EFFECTS OF 5G

The use of mobile wireless technologies continues to increase world wide. A new faster 5th generation (5G) telecommunication system has recently been approved by the Federal communications commission (FCC) with new antennae which is already being installed and tested while it may give us more automation and instantaneous interactive entertainment.

Public Health Issues: Millimeter waves (MMW) are mostly absorbed within 1 to 2 millimeters of human skin and in the surface layer of the tissues. Thus, the skin or near-surface zones of tissues are the primary targets of the radiation. Since skin contains capillaries and nerve endings.

Radiation: 5G speed range can lead to mutation of cells and cause tumors which might later become cancer.

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
